What is a work scholarship?

The Door County Folk Festival runs as smooth as it does largely thanks to the efforts of our work scholars. As a work scholar you would work part of the time during the festival. In return you receive financial support for the festival. Our idea is to work hard and play hard. We hope that you find a work scholarship a very enjoyable and satisfying experience as well as a great deal.



What work is involved?

A typical work scholarship involves the following:

- For 2008, Setup and Teardown. Setup requires arriving in Sister Bay Wednesday morning. Cleanup requires staying until 1:00 PM on Monday.
- Scheduled Work. Every work scholar will receive a schedule of particular jobs to do the festival. The most common of these is sitting at the registration desk to register and help festival goers. Other duties include keeping the kitchen clean, making lemonade, and helping at the fish boil.
- General Help. Throughout the festival you are expected to help keep things smooth. This involves answering questions, doing odd jobs, and keeping an eye on things.
- Miscellaneous. There are a variety of small jobs that make the festival run smoothly. These include putting up flyers, moving equipment around, etc.

This may sound like a lot and it is, but it leaves plenty of time for dancing. We'll also try to schedule you so that you can enjoy the particular workshops and activities you are most interested in

What financial support is available?

Generally our work scholars receive the following support.

- A weekend pass to all Festival workshops and parties
- A ticket to the fish boil dinner or group dinner
- A discount on the CD set
- A discount on lodging (2 beds, 2 people per room)

We are asking for \$100 from each work scholar to help cover our lodging costs. All together this is a substantial savings (the normal price is at over \$320). If the cost is still an obstacle please contact us. We are very happy to be flexible finding an arrangement that works for both you and us.
