What's the Door County Folk Festival (DCFF)? – www.dcff.net

DCFF is one of the most fun-filled, enjoyable and educational dance weekends in the Midwest, attracting hundreds of participants to Wisconsin, from all around the U.S., Canada and other countries. The Festival features ethnic & contra dance workshops and parties, singing workshops, singers & musicians jam sessions, activities for children, a pot-luck picnic, a traditional Door County Fish Boil Dinner and More. The Festival is staffed by some of the best local dance leaders, teachers and callers in the Midwest and beyond.

What's the commitment?

DCFF has several commitment levels – including: full, partial and special. We need the equivalent of twelve (12) full-time work scholars. A full-time commitment for the entire weekend is between 10-15 hours. A rough rule of thumb is that you will be busy 1/4 to 1/3 of the time during the festival.

What's the reward?

For returnees, scholarships will be awarded based on prior years' performance. For first timers scholarships will be awarded based on the Team Leaders' reviews of the applications. Work scholars work hard, play hard, have a critical role in helping things run smoothly, and are rewarded accordingly. In exchange for a mutually agreed upon level of work, work scholars receive a pass to festival events, a lodging discount, and discounts on the Music CDs and Dance Syllabi. All lodging is with a roommate (another work scholar) in a room with two beds. The cost of lodging is based on the number of nights you stay and whether you are working on setup/teardown. The work scholar program does not cover transportation costs or other meals and incidentals.

How do I apply?

If you're ready to commit, we should talk ASAP. We need both full-time and part-time work scholars. Please be clear as to whether you are applying for a full-time or part-time position. Full-time usually requires being present at setup (Wednesday) or clean-up (Monday) but not necessarily both. Exceptions can be discussed.
